FRIENDLIES GUIDANCE

This guidance applies to Adult and Junior Friendly matches

Friendly matches need to be sanctioned. How they are sanctioned depends on the nature of the friendly match. All friendlies must be played in accordance with the Laws of the Game and be controlled by a match referee. If one club is directly affiliated to the FAW that club can book the friendly via Comet. Otherwise, follow the guidance set out below.

1. Friendly match between two clubs both affiliated to Central Wales FA

- (a) Ensure both clubs are affiliated
- (b) Home club notifies CWFA secretary of;
 - (i) The clubs involved
 - (ii) The date and kick off time
 - (iii) The venue

2. Friendly match between two clubs, one affiliated to CWFA, the other affiliated to a different Area Association within Wales

Both clubs must have permission/sanction from their home Association Notify CWFA secretary of;

- (iv) The clubs involved
- (v) The date and kick off time
- (vi) The venue
- (vii) That the other club has obtained or has applied for permission from its home association.

3. Away friendly match against a club from outside Wales

The sanction of the FAW is required to play a friendly match outside Wales. Download the form entitled Sanction Request for Friendlies in other NA's. Complete it then e-mail it to the FAW and to the CWFA secretary

4. Home friendly against a club from outside Wales

Follow the procedure set out in section 2 above.
